Christian schools provide a community where true believers, regardless of church affiliation, can share the parents' task of raising their children to love the Lord above all else.

Teachers, in obedience to God and in partnership with parents, have a unique responsibility while educating children in the school.

Teachers must understand their role in children's lives and skillfully integrate faith and learning.

Students will learn to view the world through the eye-glasses of God-given faith.

Although living in a culture that is confused by a lack of moral absolutes, our children can discover the truth of all things if they are taught to look with eyes of faith.

Parents and teachers will nurture children so they learn with their heads, hearts, and hands.

It will be evident that the facts and concepts of subject matter are fully learned when children can incorporate them into behaviors and activities.

Faith and learning that is transformed into faith and actions changes culture.
